RABBINICAL REFLECTIONS

Friends:

Each year, we dispel the darkness of the winter nights with the increasingly luminous light of our Chanukah candles. In the words of the Chanukah song: "Ba'nu Choshech L'Garesh..." – "We come to banish the darkness / In our hands is light and flame / Each of us is a small light / Together we produce a mighty blaze!"

This year, as we approach Chanukah, the Jewish People is enduring dark times. As we celebrate the victory of the Hasmoneans – the Maccabees – against a cruel

enemy intent on destroying Jewish life, the State of Israel is at war to eradicate a genocidal terrorist threat in the wake of atrocities and human losses not suffered by our People since the Holocaust. Antisemitism is rising in many countries including our own, painfully so on college campuses, and has metastasized on the fringes of both the political right and the political left. There is much darkness to dispel.

"Together we produce a mighty beacon" – During these dark times, Jewish unity and communal cohesion have grown dramatically. Investment in community – and the benefits and blessings that arise from identifying actively, openly, and personally with community – has led to a rise in participation and attendance here at Temple Emanuel of North Jersey, as elsewhere. I urge you to join that trend and to connect with community and congregation – with Jewish celebration and observance – at a time when the "small light" each of us can maintain needs to be fanned into a blazing spiritual, religious and moral beacon. That we can achieve most effectively only together.

What better time for rededicating ourselves to community, tradition, and advocacy for Jewish sovereignty, freedom, and security in Israel than Chanukah... the Festival of Light... the Holiday of Rededication?!

We as American Jews have an indispensable role to play as advocates for Israel and the Zionist cause during these dark days. Let us remember – and take to heart – the words of American Zionist leader and U.S. Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis:

"As part of the eternal world-wide struggle for democracy, the struggle of the Maccabees is of eternal worldwide interest. It is a struggle of Jews today, as well as those of 2,000 years ago. It is a struggle of America as well as of [the Land of Israel]. It is a struggle in which all Americans, non-Jews as well as Jews, should be vitally interested because they are vitally affected."

Guide to Lighting Chanukah Candles

Using an extra candle called the Shamash, light one candle on the first night (starting at the extreme right side of the chanukiah) and add a candle each night. Always begin by lighting the newest candle first. One should light Chanukah candles near a window, visible from outside.

Each night, before lighting the candles, the first two blessings below are recited. On the first night, the third blessing is added.

Blessed are You, Lord our God, King of the Universe who sanctified us with his commandments and commanded us to kindle the Chanukah light.



Dear Friends of Temple Emanuel

In order to be sensible and wise, Temple Emanuel of North Jersey has extended our use of security personnel to make our congregants feel secure and safe in these unstable times. I am pleased to report that our Shabbat attendance has been good during this world situation.

I am sure you will understand that although we have a security fee as part of our dues structure, we have nevertheless seen a significant drain to our budget in order to provide the additional security measures needed during these troubling times. Regrettably, I must ask you for additional support so we can continue to provide the security that our members expect and deserve.

Our increased security costs us from \$60 to \$150 per hour depending on the circumstances. A typical Shabbat Service requires 4 to 6 hours of security coverage. Franklin Lakes police do provide some drive through surveillance at no cost, and we are grateful for that. But it is not enough.


